

- Climate surveys






Importance of Tracking Academic Progress

Looking ahead: Academic Requirements Completion System (ARCS)




New System Goals:

- "Road Map" to Degree Completion for Students
- Online routing and tracking for all academic milestones
- Inclusion of English Language Proficiency requirements
- Inclusion of Professional Development engagement
- Status of Research Compliance and Biosafety (RCB) review for Research Proposals
- Automation of multiple manual audits and entry points in current processes



Looking ahead: Academic Requirements Completion System (ARCS)



New System Development Challenges

- Competing with undergraduate and other functional area projects for priority
- Resources, including in-house technical staff and funding limitations
- Banner 9 implementation coinciding with development timeline
- Transition and implementation



Reporting (distributed internally to colleges)

Annual reports:

- Graduate Assistant (GA) Salary Report: by degree objective level, GA Type, college/division, and department.
- Graduate Student Support Report: by degree objective level, FA Type, college, department, major, gender, race/ethnicity.
- Enrollment, Degrees Awarded, Retention, and Time To Degree Reports: by degree objective level, college, department, major, gender, race/ethnicity, intersection of gender & race/ethnicity, citizenship
