What: Structure of PhD program

How: Adapted assessment template to ongoing review efforts

Results:

- Documentation
- Annual Review of students

# HISTORY

What: Preparation for the job market.

How: Survey of current students and recent alums

Results:

- Strengths of program
- Need for preparation for careers outside the academy

# THEOLOGY

**What:** Learning objectives for dissertation and language proficiency

**How:** Faculty review of dissertations and proposals

**Results (handout):**

- Clarification of expectations
- Consider language proficiency criteria for dissertation proposal.

# PHILOSOPHY

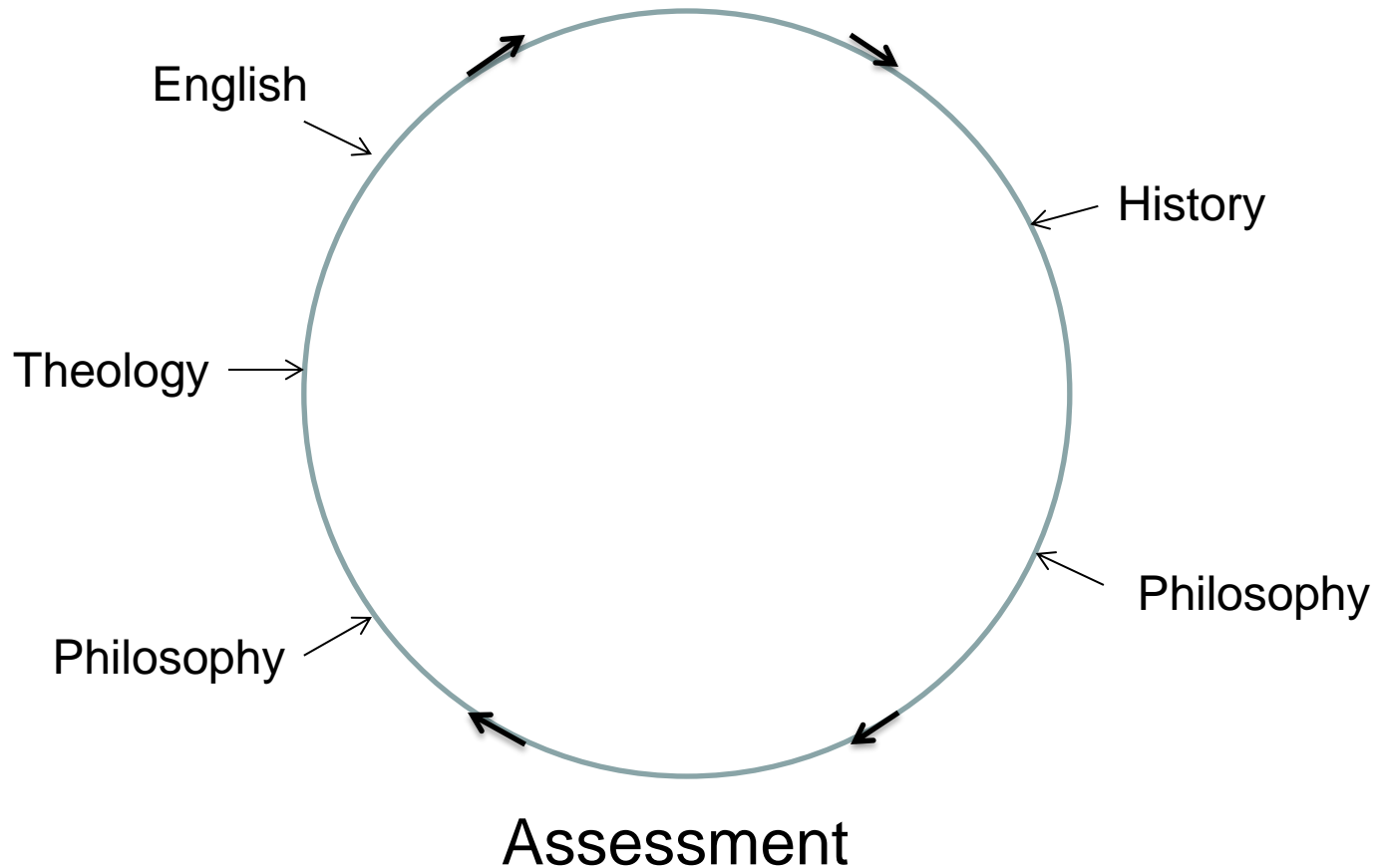
What: Goal of producing “high quality philosophical writing”

How: Review of qualifying papers

Results:

- Year 1: General statistics on pass rates
- Year 2: Identified problems with specific learning objectives particularly in relation to new pro-seminar (handout).
