and language proficiency

How: Faculty review of dissertations and

proposals

Results (handout):

- Clarification of expectations
- Consider language proficiency criteria for dissertation proposal.

PHILOSOPHY


What: Goal of producing "high quality

philosophical writing"

How: Review of qualifying papers

Results:

- Year 1: General statistics on pass rates
- Year 2: Identified problems with specific learning objectives particularly in relation to new pro-seminar (handout).
