Montclair State University – TIMELINE


- 1908 Founded as the New Jersey State Normal School at Montclair.
- 1910 The school's first graduating class numbers just 45.
- <u>1927</u> The school is renamed Montclair State Teachers College and State Normal School at Montclair and offers a four-year teaching degree.
- 1929 New Jersey State Teachers College at Montclair.
- 1932 Montclair is authorized to grant master's degrees.
- 1958 After a merger with the Panzer School of Physical Education, Montclair State College is established.
- **1966** Montclair State becomes a multi-purpose institution, admitting its first liberal arts students.
- <u>1994</u> Montclair State College becomes Montclair State University.
- 1997 The Graduate School is created.
- <u>1998</u> Montclair State receives approval from the New Jersey Commission on Higher Education to offer a doctor of education degree in pedagogy, the first doctoral program in its 90-year history.
- 2008 Montclair State University celebrates its centennial.
- <u>2015</u> Montclair State graduates 3,392 undergraduate students, 1,106 graduate students and 26 doctoral students; a total of 4,872 students.




