The Public Research University

- Graduate education, particularly doctoral education is central to the mission of the research university.
- The Graduate Dean needs to be an advocate for the importance of graduate education to the mission of the university.

How to be an effective advocate?

- Become knowledgeable about your graduate programs so that you can speak passionately about the issues
- Find opportunities to make the case for graduate education
- Highlight graduate student successes
- Be prepared to articulate the message and needs

What does advocacy look like?

- Informing key campus constituents about issues (e.g. ACA, FLSA, financial aid)
 - Meetings (Provost, deans, HR, GEMC, GPDs)
 - Communicate with federal liaison
 - Memos
 - Social media (blogs, twitter)
- Highlight graduate education
 - Website
 - Flyers
 - Brochures

- Foster communication
 - Graduate Enrollment Management Committee
 - Dean's Council on Graduate Education

Science and Engineering
Alfred Mole, Professor of Philosophy, received a three-year, \$4.5 million grant from the John Templeton Foundation to study the Philosophy and Science of Self-Control. The project involves researchers from around the world.

Nyuan Shi, Assistant Professor of Statistics, received a prestigious Faculty Early Career Development (CAREER) Award from the National Science Foundation. She is studying "Big data", which are difficult to process using common statistics-management tools.

Hui "Helen" Li, Professor of Electrical and Computer Engineering is spearheading a team of FSU researchers, which will work with other universities and private companies as part of the Public-Private Manufacturing Innovation Institute. The new institute focuses on development of next-generation electronics.

Social and Behavioral Sciences
The Center for Hispanic Marketing Communication at the FSU College of Communication & Information is devoted to educating students and professionals in the field of Hispanic marketing and advertising.

Creative and Performing Arts
Francis Eppes Professor of English and Pulitzer Prize recipient Robert Olen Butler, added another honor to his list of accolades. The latest honor, the F. Scott Fitzgerald Award for Outstanding Achievement in American Literature, recognizes his

Faculty and students working with the Center are conducting groundbreaking research and serving as an innovative resource for the U.S. Hispanic marketing industry. A \$1.4 million federal grant from the National Institute on Minority Health and Health Disparities, was awarded to a FSU-led research team partnering with churches in Gadsden and Leon counties to combat the leading cause of death for African-American men and women — cardiovascular disease. Professor Penny Halston is the principal investigator and dean emerita of FSU's College of Human Sciences.

Workplace and Society
Young-Suk Kim was honored with the Presidential Early Career Award for Scientists and Engineers for her research in language and literacy development. It is the highest honor bestowed by departments of the U.S. government on scientists and engineers in the early stages of their independent research careers. Kim is an Associate

Professor of Reading and Language Arts in the School of Teacher Education. She is also a faculty member at the Florida Center for Reading Research.

The U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) awarded a \$1.4 million grant to a consortium of researchers from Florida State, Florida A&M University (FAMU) and the University of North Florida (UNF) to fund the Center for Accessibility and Safety for an Aging Population (ASAP). Neil Charness, Professor of Psychology, and Jeffrey Brown, Associate Professor of Urban and Regional Planning, will serve as the center's associate directors.

The FSU College of Law's Black Law Students Association won first place in the National Black Law Students Association's Thurgood Marshall Mock Trial Competition. Eighteen teams from around the nation participated, including teams from Harvard and the University of Florida. FSU researchers received a two-year, nearly \$25 million National Institutes of Health grant, to screen infants who are only 12 months old using smart technology that can search simultaneously for both autism and communication delays. Distinguished Research Professor Amy Weatherly, director of the FSU Autism Institute, is leading the research.

Florida State University's online graduate program in nursing was ranked No. 5 among public universities according to U.S. News & World Reports 2014 Best Online Program Rankings.

ANGELA JARRETT - GAANN FELLOW

Ms. Jarrett is a 5th year PhD student in Biomathematics. Her work focuses on MRSA, the strain of bacteria which is problematic because of its extreme resistance to antibiotics. Ms. Jarrett uses mathematical modeling to predict the behavior and spread of MRSA in individuals. This research is important for predicting how MRSA and other diseases spread through human populations.



GREGORY DUNGAN - GAANN FELLOW


Dr. Dungan is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Mathematics at West Point. He received his Bachelors and PhD degrees in Mathematics from Florida State University. His graduate education, facilitated by the GAANN Program enables him to be an effective teacher and provide cadets with the necessary foundational skills to be successful as Army officers.

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
