## **TYPES OF BUDGET MODELS\***

- Incremental Budgeting
  - Based upon the funding levels of the previous year
- Zero-Based Budget
  - Must re-request funding levels, and all spending must be re-justified
- Activity-Based Budgeting
  - Awards financial resources to institutional activities that see the greatest return (in the form of increased revenues)
- Responsibility Center Management
  - RCM delegates operational authority to units within an institution, also responsible for their own expenses
- Centralized Budgeting
  - All decision-making powers are in the hands of upper level administration.
- Performance-Based Budgeting
  - Awards funds based on performance

## ADVOCATING FOR GRADUATE EDUCATION AT YOUR INSTITUTION

- Have a clear value statement that articulates the value of Graduate Education.
  - Can be simple and direct
  - Can include value to the community at large
- Prioritize your emphasis points
  - Know what is important to the Provost and President
    - PhD production
    - Masters production
  - Know what is important to your colleagues
    - GTA support and stipends
    - External Grants and Sponsorship

## **BUDGETING: DEVELOPING AND USING FUNDING STREAMS**

- Creating Budget submissions
  - Identify your sources of funding
  - Use the fees budget as needed
- Prioritizing Allocations
- Advocate for increased funding where necessary
- Find new sources of Income
  - Develop new fees to be used in a discretionary manner
  - Grants and Contracts
- Partnering with others on Campus
  - Sharing budget resources

#### **EXAMPLES OF ADVOCATING**

- A University wanted to find a way to increase stipends. They had not been increased for years
  - After three years of advocating for a stipend increase the University funded the Graduate School with an additional \$1 million.
  - They created an allocation scheme that increased the lowest paid first.
  - Still had a gap for competitive stipends. The University added \$500,000 the next year to address competitive stipends.
  - Both allocation schemes had support across the campus
- A University pulled funding for graduate student travel two years ago.
  - Allocated a portion of our operating budget to continue to fund student travel.
  - Added a request to the budget to fund student travel this year.

#### **LESSONS LEARNED**

- One Institution is changing budget models from Incremental to RCM
  - Need to take time to implement
  - Great concern among programs that have not had to operate in this mode previously
- An Institution wanted to change the way funds were used to recruit high profile PhD students
  - If people have been using money in the way they want, getting them to change it is a BIG issue.
  - If you are going to make a change in how people can spend the money allocated to them, you need to get their input.
  - One size does NOT fit all, so allowing some department by department flexibility is important.
  - When you make a mistake, be willing to admit it and change things up.
