
Loyola University and Graduate School Mission and Core Values

- •600 graduate faculty




Loyola, Chicago and the Community of Rogers Park

- Complexities involved in developing community/academic partnerships
- ■The "Hierarchical Dilemma"
 - Valuing discovery over other forms of scholarly activity
 - Valuing federal funding over other forms of funding
 - Valuing top tier journals over applied journals
