Summer Research Opportunities Program (SROP)

- 24th year of participation by CIC institutions to increase the number of underrepresented students who pursue a Ph.D. degree or research career.
- 8-10 week full-time summer research experience for U.S. citizens/permanent residents from U.S. institutions.
- All expenses paid plus stipend for participants.
- Campus-based enrichment workshops and opportunities, and 40 hours of research each week.
- Annual academic research conference for all participants hosted by a CIC institution.

The Adam W. Herbert STEM Initiative

Partnership between Indiana University and eleven HBCU's.

 Program designed to create a pool of underrepresented students for graduate study in STEM who upon degree completion will return to HBCU's or IU as faculty.

- Components of the program:
 - Summer Scholars Institute
 - Multi-year funding for doctoral and master's students
 - Collaborative research between IU and HBCU faculty
 - Visiting Scholars Program

GETTING YOU INTO

 Two-day program designed to create a pool of underrepresented students for Ph.D. programs at Indiana University in Bloomington and Indianapolis.

 Prospective students nominated by faculty from U.S. institutions, 25 selected for participation by IU departments.

 Customized visit for each participant to provide interaction with future peers, faculty, and the broader campus community.
