 - Key Messages/Goals
 - Information about your Institution/Organization
 - Brief outline of your "asks"
 - Highlight Your Expertise

Prepare Goals and Messaging:


- Personalize Message
- Know the Big Picture and Key Legislative Issues
- Be an Honest Broker
- Use Data
- Avoid Jargon
